REDUCED SPEED LIMITS IN SCHOOL ZONES

On July 4, 2012 the Executive Policy Committee of the City of Winnipeg, approved the guiding principles associated with signing reduced speed limits in school zones at relevant schools in Winnipeg. The school zone speed limit is set to 30 km/h for schools that include grade 6 or lower. The limits are in force Monday to Friday 7:00-17:30, in the months of September to June.
