LICE ADVISE

Here are a few helpful tidbits about head lice:

The only way to get rid of lice and nits are to pick them out. Lice cannot fly or jump. They must crawl from head to head. A nit must have the warmth of a human head to survive. As soon as it is not next to a head it dies within 24 hours. Most lice will die within 24 hours of not being in contact with a food source. They find it very difficult to live on coats, stuffed toys, and other soft surfaces such as mattresses furniture. Lice have a blood type. The first blood it feeds on is the type it needs to survive. Lice may not live if they crawl onto another host who has a different blood type. Be warned, if they lays eggs before they die the newly hatched lice will survive on the new host head. Lice are not discouraged by hair spray or other hair products. If you discover lice on your child's head, you must pick them out and do the following things in your home:

- 1. Wash all bedding, towels and clothing worn in the last 24 hours. It is not necessary to use hot water but you must put all bedding, towels and clothing into the dryer on the highest setting for at least 30 minutes.
- 2. Put any combs, brushes or hair accessories in the freezer for at least 2 hours to kill any lice that may be on the items.
- 3. Advise the school and any other parents your children have been around.
- 4. Items such as car seats, furniture, stuffed toys and mattresses do not have to bagged or put outside. Lice

- cannot survive on these surfaces. They need food!
- 5. The best type of comb to use is a metal comb such as the "Nit free Terminator"
- 6. Continue to check your child's head on a weekly basis.
