Big thank you to all those who were able to join us at the Annual General Meeting held on October 26 at Lennox Hall. This was a great opportunity to hear from our new school administrator Mrs. Laura Carreiro, who offered some great insight into her background, both from a personal side (having been born in Sao Miguel, Portugal) and from a professional perspective about her educational vision and beliefs.



We shared information about what the Board has been up to over the past year, how we're progressing with the 2015-2020 CTK Strategic Plan and highlighted some of the short-term and long-term goals.

A strong emphasis is being placed on the areas of student enrollment, infrastructure, communication and technology.

Talks of redeveloping the school playground took a more formal turn at the AGM. Everyone who attended broke out in smaller groups to discuss what they'd like to see as part of the playground, including needs, priorities and timing of improvements. Questions to consider in this first phase of planning include:

- 1. What the various age groups want/need in a playground.
- 2. Other playground priorities (e.g. accessibility, safety, and environmental.
- 3. Staging and timing of improvements.

**Quick Drop** – Parents/Guardians can stop along Fernwood Avenue to drop students off. Children can enter the school yard through the gate on Fernwood Avenue near the school bus loading area. \*Please avoid blocking the designated school bus stop.

In consideration of our neighbours in the community, please avoid using private driveways to turn your vehicle around.
