EDUCATION COMMITTEE UPDATES



The Education Committee is comprised of staff members of CTK who work on developing the school plan, ESD Plan (Education for Sustainable Development) and professional development for staff. The committee has 2 goals to report for the 2017-2018 school year:

1. Report cards have been revised for grades K-8 for the 2017-2018 school year. There will be consistency throughout the grade levels with regards to academic grade scales, formatting and reporting of outcomes and skills.

2. Thanks to the Lennox Club, we will be installing a hydration station on the main floor by the gym. This station will promote the use of reusable water bottles and is much easier to use for refilling personal water bottles. Keeping students hydrated is physiologically important for learning and will reduce waste of water as well as consumption of single use plastic bottles. This in turn helps us to be better stewards of creation.

We will be fundraising during the 2017-2018 school year for the installation of a hydration station on the second floor of our school.

MATH CONTESTS

UNIVERSITY OF WATERLOO GAUSS MATHEMATICS CONTEST

Every year, the Faculty of Mathematics at the University of Waterloo offers math contests for students across Canada and International students in grades 7 through 12. It is a program designed to promote enrichment in mathematics, and to encourage students to work on and improve problem solving skills. This year Christ the King School participated in the grade 7 and 8 math contest, called the Gauss Mathematics Contest. Congratulations to all of the students in grades 7 and 8 who participated.
