PLAYGROUND REDEVELOPMENT REPORT

CTK's Board of Directors has asked the Parent Advisory Council to spearhead the redevelopment of the school's playground. Our current playground has served CTK for many years, but it is now time to create a playground that meets the current needs of our school community. Potential improvements include installation of various new types of play equipment, seating and natural landscape features. The project will be completed in stages and will take approximately 3 years to complete. Work will be completed in phases, over summer months (2018, 2019) with the goal for completion being the fall of 2019.

A committee has been formed to lead the redevelopment project. Committee members include:

The committee will soon be engaging with school community stakeholders to determine what the playground design should look like. We are also engaging sponsors, individual donors and volunteers to support the playground redevelopment. CTK's Board of Directors has already dedicated start-up funding for the project and the Parent Advisory Committee has confirmed 2017-18 fundraising will be earmarked for the playground project.


FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING

Ways To Help Your Child With Reading At Home Home Reading is more than just completing a book and signing it in

Setting The Atmosphere

Help your child find a quiet, comfortable place to read. Have your child see you as a reading model. Read aloud to your child and reread favorite stories. Read with your child. This includes labels, signs, magazines and mail.

Discuss pictures and their details.

Discuss the stories you read together, and make predictions before and during reading. Take short breaks and ask your child questions during reading. Questions should be: factual – What was the dog's name? opinion – What did you think was the funniest part? inferencing – How would the story have been different if....

Responding to Errors in Reading

While phonics is an important part of reading, reading for meaning is the primary goal. To produce independent readers who monitor and correct themselves as they read. The following prompts are recommended *before* saying "sound it out."

Wait 5 to 10 seconds to see what they attempt to do to help themselves.

Then:

- "What would make sense there?"
- "What do you think the word could be?"
- "Use the picture to help you figure out what the word could be."
- "Go back to the beginning and try that again."
- "Skip over it and read to the end of the sentence. Now what do you think it is?"
- "Look at how the word begins, start it out and keep reading."
- Tell your child the word.

Most important, focus on what your child is doing well and attempting to do. Be loving and supportive. When your child is having difficulty, try the following comments:

- "Good for you. I like the way you tried to work that out."
- "That was a good try. Yes, that word would make sense there."
- "I liked the way you looked at the picture to help yourself."
- "I liked the way you went back to the beginning of the sentence and tried that again. That's what good readers do."

Always encourage your child to enjoy a variety of books. When reading for practice, make sure the material is at their level. Check with your child's teacher if you need help.
