EDUCATION COMMITTEE REPORT

The Education Committee is comprised of CTK staff members and develops goals for the school, the ESD Plan, and professional development for staff. This past school year, our school goals have been achieved. We exceeded our first goal in the ESD Plan. With the help of the Lennox Club and School Board, we were able to purchase and install not only one, but two hydration stations! One was installed outside the gym and the other was installed upstairs. Our second goal of implementing a new report card for K-8 was also accomplished.





Another goal for this school year was to improve students' math fact recall. Our goal was to

have the majority of students achieve 85% or higher in basic fact automaticity. The school purchased a software subscription to the Mathletics program for Gr. 5-8. This program not only supports Manitoba curriculum in all strands, but also has a game component to practice math facts. Teachers did other instruction and practice of math facts in the classroom as well. Students were evaluated in September, January, and May to track progress. Our final results show that the majority of students in Gr. 2-8 were able to achieve basic fact automaticity in operations.

As part of the Well-Being and Mental Health component of our ESD Plan, we have continued the House Team meetings with emphasis on the lives of the saints and how we can all learn from their example to be better people. We also continued with Project 11 in grades 5-8. These will be continued for the 2018-2019 school year.

A new goal for Well-Being and Mental Health is to implement Kelso's Choice in K-5 and the Ophelia Project in 5-8 in the 2018-2019 school year. These programs teach students how to deal with conflict resolution and prosocial skills.



As part of the Environment component of the 2018/2019 ESD Plan, the school is working towards replacing the bike rack with a new one, and encourage the use of bicycles as a form of transportation to and from school.

Lastly, we are also looking at waste reduction in the 2018/2019 school year. We will be implementing a Staples Recycling Program for writing instruments such as markers, highlighters, and pens. We will be collecting plastic bags in October for the Multi-Material Stewardship Manitoba Take Pride Winnipeg Bag Up Challenge in order to help our community reduce the number of plastic bags going into our landfills. A year long waste reduction project will be Wasteless Wednesdays. Students and staff will be asked to reduce the



garbage they produce once a week. Since lunch waste tends to be the largest contributor of garbage in the classroom, families would be encouraged to use re-usable containers, reduce items with packaging, and use utensils that are non-disposable. More information about these initiatives will come in September.

A big thank you to Mrs. Dhillon and Juliano for sharing Juliano's first year of life with us! It


was a pleasure watching him reach so many milestones with us – smiling, sitting up, getting teeth, rolling over and crawling!





WISE (Women in Science and Engineering)



On May 10th, Grades 4, 6, 7 and 8 had the privilege of participating in some workshops provided by WISE (Women in Science and Engineering). Each grade participated in the Codebreakers workshop in which students used tablets to program and control robots via Bluetooth. The students had fun learning how to make their robots move in different directions, say certain phrases, and light up in different patterns. Some students tried moving their robots through an obstacle course, and the Grade 7/8's tried to play a robot soccer game!



In addition to the Codebreakers workshop, the Grade 6 class also had a workshop on electricity to coincide with their science unit on the topic. Students used "Snap It" electricity kits to build simple circuits that included lights, motors, and speakers. Fun was had by all!


