

Here we are already approaching the end of another calendar year. It seemed like a few short months ago that we dropped off our children for the first day of school.






### STUDENT COUNCIL

## PHYSICAL EDUCATION NEWS



Volleyball season ended at the end of November and I can honestly say that the future looks very bright for Royals volleyball in 2019. Our developmental boys team progressed very well by seasons end, and that invaluable court experience will certainly help next season. Our grade 6 girls went to two tournaments recently, placing 2<sup>nd</sup> at St Alphonsus and winning all matches played at St Maurice. Our Competitive boys team as well as our 6/7 Competitive girls squad both finished in 6<sup>th</sup> place after playoffs.

Thank you to coaches Malo, Romeo, and Harrington, all of your coaching

expertise certainly put a positive spin to our student athletes.

It is always tough after volleyball to get the student athletes "into" basketball, and we will be having three teams that will begin league play at the end of January, two developmental teams (boys and girls) and a competitive boys squad.

In the Royal Dome, physical education classes worked on Fitness Testing in grades 3-7, which included a Beep Endurance Test that the students were surprisingly enthusiastic to do. Beep Test will be done once a month from November to June, which is a running test that measures a student's fitness and endurance level.

Starting in February, the grades 2 and 3 students will be participating in a Learn To Skate program for five Thursdays. Even though some of the students may already be good skaters, you never stop practicing to be better. Even the top professional athletes practice their skill(s).

During Catholic Schools week in February, the students will be going to Dakota Lanes for bowling, and TBA, the grades 6 and 7 students will be going skiing to Stony Mountain Ski Area.

CHESS CLUB for Grades 4-8 will take place January 9 – 30 every Wednesday morning from 8:15 –




8:48 a.m. (four sessions Jan 9, 16, 23 & 30). We will be meeting in the Grade 6 classroom.
