#### **OCTOBER VISIT TO WINNIPEG HARVEST**

On October 10, the Grade 6 class visited Winnipeg Harvest as part of the school's Year of Gratitude. Here is what some student had to say:

"...We went on a long tour through the building and we made Breakfast 2 Go bags for children who can't have breakfast [on the weekend]. I learned that they get about 12 million pounds of food per year. They grow a garden behind their building and grow herbs and other things. I found it interesting that the only thing Winnipeg Harvest buys from the store is baby formula, and that they get about 5000 bread items a day. I felt happy that I was helping kids who don't have breakfast have one. I also felt kind and happy when I made the cards to put into the bags. I enjoyed our field trip to Winnipeg Harvest!" - Kate

"...I learned that helping people is so amazing, and something small will make someone so happy. There are lots of food banks you can



help out at. I'm so grateful for shelter and food. It was a fun field trip knowing that we volunteered for 1 hour and 30 minutes and that we helped 300 kids from schools in Winnipeg, Manitoba. It was tons of fun!" – Elizabeth

"It was very interesting at Winnipeg Harvest. I learned that Winnipeg Harvest feeds over 62 000 people a month. I learned that Winnipeg Harvest gets food from food bins that are almost in each store throughout the city and that there are a lot of people that need food and help. Some people do not have food for breakfast so we made Breakfast to Go. We made 300 bags of food for breakfast and in each bag there was milk, yogurt, cheese, Cheerios, [apples], and oranges." – Jakob

# **CTK Resource Corner**

# TRAIN THEIR BRAIN

You can make a difference in your child's life by training your child's brain so that your child will successfully function on social, emotional, and academic levels. Here is how:

#### 1. Don't be afraid to set the limits. Kids need limits to grow happy and healthy!!

- Make a schedule for meal times, sleep times, technology time
- Think of what is GOOD for them- not what they WANT/DON'T WANT. They are going to thank you for that later on in life. Parenting is a hard job. You need to be creative to make them do what is good for them because, most of the time, that is the exact opposite of what they want.

• Kids need breakfast and nutritious food. They need to spend time outdoor and go to bed at a consistent time in order to come to school available for learning the next day!

• Convert things that they don't like doing/trying into fun, emotionally stimulating games.

#### 2. Limit technology, and re-connect with your kids emotionally

• Surprise them with flowers, share a smile, tickle them, put a love note in their backpack or under their pillow, surprise them by taking them out for lunch on a school day, dance together, crawl together, have pillow fights

• Have family dinners, board game nights, go biking, go on outdoor walks with a flashlight in the evening

#### 3. Train delayed gratification

- Make them wait!!! It is ok to have "I am bored" time this is the first step to creativity
- Gradually increase the waiting time between "I want" and "I get"
- Avoid technology use in cars and restaurants, and instead teach them waiting while talking and playing games
- Limit constant snacking

# 4. Teach your child to do monotonous work from early years as it is the foundation for future "workability"

• Folding laundry, tidying up toys, hanging clothes, unpacking groceries, setting the table, making lunch, unpacking their lunch box, making their bed

• Be creative. Initially make it stimulating and fun so that their brain associates it with something positive.

#### 5. Teach social skills

• Teach them turn taking, sharing, losing/winning, compromising, complimenting others, using "please and thank you"

Help your kids succeed in life by training and strengthening their brain sooner rather than later!

#### FIELD TRIPS, COACHING AND OVERNIGHT CAMPS



As mandated by the Archdiocese of St. Boniface and Winnipeg and the Catholic Schools Commission, all volunteers who may be left alone with students during the regular school day or persons acting as supervising volunteers on overnight field trips, camping trips or coaching students are required to complete a Child Abuse Registry Check and Criminal Record Check. The Criminal Record Check must be done on your own either online or in person at the Winnipeg Police Service

station, 245 Smith Street. If you are using this for school purposes, the cost will be reimbursed to you once you submit your receipt to the office.

## PICK-UP & DROP-OFF — ABSENT/LATE

#### \*\*DRIVE THROUGH DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP IS NOT PERMITTED IN THE PARKING LOT.

The parking lot is a hectic place before and after school. For the safety of all students and visitors at Christ the King School we have two options for getting your child into the schoolyard **safely:** 



1) Park and Walk – Parents/Guardians are welcome to park in the designated spot in the parking lot next to the school yard. Students can then exit the parked vehicle and walk (or be accompanied) through the parking lot to the school yard. Before/After school students must be signed in and out when being dropped off or picked up.

2) Quick Drop – Parents/Guardians can stop along Fernwood Avenue to drop students off. Children can enter the school yard through the gate on Fernwood Avenue near the school bus loading area. \*Please avoid blocking the designated school bus stop. In consideration of our neighbours in the community, please avoid using private drive-ways to turn your vehicle around.



Absent/Late — Following the policies of the Parent Handbook, it is the parents' responsibility to call the office (204) 257-0027 or email <u>office@ctkschool.ca</u> (cc. your child's teacher) if your child will be absent or late. If we do not hear from you, it is our responsibility to contact you to be sure your child is safely with you or a guardian.
