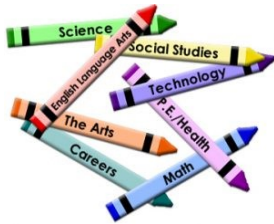




## EDUCATION COMMITTEE

The Education Committee would like to share with the CTK community some of the school goals that have been achieved for the 2018-2019 school year and those that we are working towards for the 2019-2020 school year.

As part of the Environment component of our ESD Plan, our school has participated in several recycling programs such as battery recycling, Tabs for Wheelchairs, Staples, Bag Up Manitoba (Take Pride Winnipeg) and general recycling of paper, plastic, cardboard and drink containers. Students also took part in “Wasteless Wednesdays” to help reduce the amount of garbage in their classroom each week. We will continue these recycling programs as well as “Wasteless Wednesdays” for the 2019-2020 school year. A new goal for next school year is to work towards replacing the bike rack with a new one and acquire a Friendship Bench for our playground.



As part of the Well-Being and Mental Health component of our ESD Plan, we have continued the House Team meetings with emphasis on the Fruits of the Spirit of self-control, joy, goodness, gentleness and patience. We also implemented Project 11 in Gr. 4 and Kelso’s Choice in K-5 as well as Ophelia Project in Grades 6-8. These will be continued for the 2019-2020 school year. A new goal is to implement Mind Up in K-4. This program helps students focus their attention, improve their self-regulation skills, build resilience to stress, and develop a positive mind-set in both school and life.



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For the 2019-2020 school year we will be implementing a new guided reading program in K-3 and benchmarks for reading and writing in K-8. Our Math goals will include using the Prodigy app in Grades 3-8 and Mathletics in Grades 7-8. Each grade will also be participating in a new poverty reduction outreach project called “Helping Hands”. More information about these initiatives will come in September.

## GUIDED READING NEWS



We are excited to be building a Guided Reading library at Christ the King School for the 2019-2020 school year! Students and teachers from Grade K-4 can access a variety of fiction and non-fiction reading material. Over \$2,800 was spent to purchase 53 kits containing 318 books with teacher's guides.

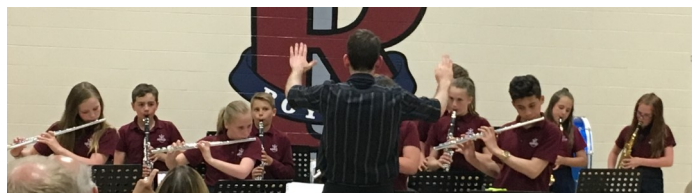


## BAND PROGRAM

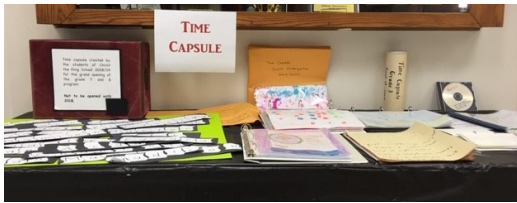


## CANADA DAY CELEBRATION
