

Constable Marty Visit to the Grade 6 Class

On Monday, April 19th, 2021, Special Constable Marty came to the Grade 6 class. He came to talk about online safety, how it affects students, and how to stay safe as well as what to expect. In his presentation, we learned about online safety, online predators, and social media. An online predator is exactly what it sounds like, a predator who is online to find victims. They are usually male, and the targets are 10-15 years old. 80% of the targets are female and 20% of them are male. To protect yourself, just don't talk with strangers. Chat with people you know.

Constable Marty was very specific to what he wants us to do to be safe. Three most important rules to protect ourselves

- I- Never talk to strangers online.
- 2- Don't share any personal information; that includes your name, age, gender, home address, email address, name of your school, not even the name of your pet.
- 3- Never disclose your location.

Not only did Constable Marty give advice to the students, but to the parents as well. Five key things to remember:

- I-Get involved. Learn what your children are doing online.
- 2-Are they being cyberbullied? Are they doing the bullying? If your child is a victim of cyberbullying, report it to an adult. Do not delete the offending conversations!
- 3-Establish rules that set boundaries about where, when, and for how long your children can use their devices.
- 4-Help your child create a password that is difficult to guess. Password must include a capital letter, a number, and a special character. Do not share password with anybody other than a parent!
- 5- Check over their contacts, who they call, who they chat with, and what sites they visit. It'll be for your child's safety and wellbeing.










CTK Board Recognition Awards for attending CTK from junior kindergarten and kindergarten until grade 8
