It was incredible to see that the Grade 4's got all the questions correctly during their Jeopardy game.

From there, the students got to tour the building, and even got a glimpse of the first interview by the new Premier Wab Kinew! They were also very fortunate to get a look into the Legislative Assembly, and take a seat in the gallery. Here is what some of our Grade 6 students had to say about their experience.

"This has got to be one of our favourite field trips. We got to see lots of people who worked there. We even got to go to the chandelier room. It had pictures of queens and kings, and it also had 3 HUGE chandeliers in the middle which weighed 600 pounds! We also got to see (or meet) the Sergeant-At-Arms who is like the security guard for meeting at the Legislative Assembly. Overall, it was a real fun field trip!" - Richard

"We learned a lot of stuff such as voting and the different levels of government. GRADE 7 & 8 RETREAT




