MESSAGE FROM THE SCHOOL BOARD

Dear CTK Families,

The Christ the King (CTK) School Board has had a busy fall. The strategic plan, which was developed in the spring was approved at our fall meeting. The School's bylaws were updated and approved at the Annual General Meeting in October.

Strategic Plan

The School's strategic plan includes the following key components:

- Improve organizational staffing and volunteer capacity,
- Improve tools and technology, and maintain our physical infrastructure (building)
- Increase ongoing revenues to address strategic priorities
- Customer Satisfaction (ensure we continue to maintain high standards of academic excellence)

These priorities will drive the Board's decision-making over the next few years.

Tuition for 2024-2025

As part of the Boards' annual decision making, we met in November to set tuition and other fees for the next academic year. Each year tuition revenue provides about one-third of the school's total income, with two-thirds of our revenue being provided from the Province of Manitoba by way of an operating grant. The grant from the province is equal to one-half of the average expenditures of public schools per student. This means that **the combination of tuition and grant revenue received by CTK is 25% lower than the revenue available to public schools** to cover their operating costs.

Salaries for teachers and support staff represent about 85% of our operating costs. As a result of us having less revenue than public sector schools, our staff are paid less than their peers in the public school system. Our teachers and staff are a big reason CTK is such a special community and a great place for our children. Our employees choose to work at CTK because of their faith and dedication to our community, but we have an obligation to pay them fairly.

For many years tuition at CTK has increased by \$100 (about 4%) or less per year. With rising cost pressures across the board, and the salaries of our teachers falling behind other independent schools, we need to implement a more significant increase to tuition and other fees for next year (about 5% for tuition and changes between 0% and 11% for various other fees). Increasing fees is not a decision the Board takes lightly. We strive for our fees to remain competitive with the Independent Schools within our catchment, and to find the right balance between affordability and ensuring our students get the quality education they deserve. The updated tuition and fee schedule is available on the website.

Our community is dedicated to the academic and spiritual development of our students, and to supporting each other. The School Board provides governance oversight of the school, through the development, management, and oversight of the financial resources and policies of the school. We meet the second Wednesday of each month at 7:00pm. We meet either virtually or in person depending on the month. All are welcome to attend meetings and provide input into the direction of the school. Please check with the office to find out the location or log-in information for meetings. 




GRADE 3 FAMOUS STRUCTURE RESEARCH



Thank you to all the parents for driving their athletes to our away games, and picking up their son/daughters at both home and away contests. Without all of you, the program would not be nearly as successful.






UPCOMING CLUBS
