## Physical Education and Royals Sports

From the first day back in January to Spring Break the Physical Education/Royals program has been super busy. The grades 2 and 3 students had five Learn to Skate sessions at Dakota Community Centre, JK to grade 8 had bowling trips to Dakota Lanes during Catholic Schools Week, the grade 7 and 8 students went to Springhill Winter Park for skiing. After school, three basketball teams competed in Manitoba Catholic Schools Athletic Association (MCSAA) basketball, as well the 7 and 8 Competitive Boys placed third on the Consolation side at the annual Sports Outreach Tournament (SPORT) at St. Paul's during the Louis Riel long weekend.

As well, all grade 4-8 students competed in the Knights of Columbus Free Throw Competition at the school level during January and early February. On Saturday, February $3^{\text {rd }}$, CTK hosted the Regional Level of this competition, and our students claimed six of the ten medals presented. The Regional Award winners were:

Our two competitive basketball teams showed great promise and progress throughout the MCSAA season. The 6-8 girls stuck to the program and never gave up. The 7/8 were a bit snake-bitten, losing four games by a combined 13 points. That is basketball, a game of momentum changes and last second baskets in some cases.

Our developmental basketball team played very well in their league, and the future looks very bright for next year. Thank you to all parents who helped me throughout the season.
